Art: magnetic painting

Supplies:

3-5 metal objects that will be attracted to magnets. (Paper clip, bolts, screw, penny, nickel, etc.)

Acrylic or watercolor paints

Paper

Magnet

Styrofoam plate, cardboard box (Something to place the paper on and to move a magnet from beneath while protecting the surface.)

1.Place the paper inside the box.

2.Dip metal objects in wet paint.

3.Place one object at a time on the paper. From under the box, move the metal object around the paper using the magnet. Dip the object in paint again as needed. Use as many colors as desired.

Use different objects with varying shapes to paint.

The entire paper does not need to be covered.
